

Cookies

This site uses cookies – a packet of data sent by an internet server to a browser, which is returned by the browser each time it subsequently accesses the same server, and used to identify the user or track their access to the server. In general, cookies are used to retain user preferences, store information for things like shopping baskets and provide anonymised tracking data to third party applications like google analytics.

Our cookies help us:

- Make our website work as you'd expect
- Save you having to login every time you visit the site
- Remember your settings during and between visits
- Improve the speed and security of the site
- Allow you to share pages with social networks like Facebook

We do not use cookies to:

- Collect personal identifiable information (without your express permission)
- Pass data to advertising networks
- Pass personal identifiable data to third parties
- Pay sales commissions

Granting us permission to use cookies

If your browser (the settings on your software that you are using to view this website) is adjusted to accept cookies we take this, and your continued use of our website, to mean that you are fine with this. Should you wish to remove or not use cookies from our site, you can learn how to do this below, however, doing so will likely mean that our site will not work as you would expect.

Types of cookies we use:

Functional

These cookies are used to ensure you can correctly navigate our websites and/or share pages via social media.

Performance

These cookies are used to analyse trends, administer the website, track visitor movements and gather broad demographic information for aggregate use. We use the information to compile reports and to help us improve our websites. These cookies are not linked to personally identifiable information.

Social website cookies

- Facebook
